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Continuing Medical Education Information

Course Description

Intended for physicians and the interdisciplinary team who provide medical care to elderly adults, this course will offer an update on diagnosis, treatment, and management of a number of common health issues in the geriatrics population, along with relating how to forecasting the economical impact on clinical care of older adults and how to make a difference. Topics will include Indiana's current healthcare report card, congestive heart failure, chronic care initiatives, palliative care, pain control, Parkinson's disease, falls, wound care, transitions of care, dementia, and future models of care. The Indiana Geriatrics Society is a state affiliate of the American Geriatrics Society. The overall mission of The Indiana Geriatrics Society is to enhance the visibility of Geriatrics in Indiana. We hope to do this by providing local educational programs in geriatrics, promoting interdisciplinary care of older adults, and providing input to the national organization on policy issues. IGS will be the mechanism for the continuation of the Geriatric Education Network of Indiana which was supported by the Reynolds Foundation grant of the Indiana University School of Medicine.

Course Objectives

At the conclusion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate an increased awareness for geriatric care concerning congestive heart failure, dementia, falls, and wound care.
- Describe the current status of healthcare for the elderly in Indiana and identify ways to improve the delivery of care to older adults.
- Incorporate the concepts of new models of care in such a way to improve the quality of care for older adults.
- Apply the principles of geriatric care of older adults with respect to the transitions from hospital, to primary care, and to long-term care.
- Identify geriatric resources for questions, support, and referrals concerning the care of older adults.
